ALT meeting date:	Monday 9 April 2018
1	<p>South Island Alliance strategy</p> <p>The SIA vision, goals, principles and priorities were agreed and sent to Executive Leadership Teams within DHBs for review. A communication strategy is being drafted to accompany the new strategic direction.</p>
2	<p>SLA/workstream member nominations</p> <p>ALT requested to receive SLA/workstream membership nominations via email with a five day turnaround for approval. New SLA/workstream members will be approved by the relevant SLA/workstream, SIAPO general manager, SPaIT and ALT.</p> <p>The following membership nomination has been endorsed: Kaye Johnston, Service Manager, Canterbury DHB (Mental Health & Addictions SLA).</p>
3	<p>Connections with MoH</p> <p>The Ministerial Advisory Group will be attending the next ALT/Board meeting in June, encouraging stronger working relationships and understanding of Alliance workstreams' challenges and successes. The group advises the Minister of Health and we look forward to the opportunity to share the work of the South Island Alliance with them.</p>
4	<p>Telehealth strategy</p> <p>The final draft of the regional telehealth strategy has been completed. It is being circulated for feedback and will be tabled at the next SPaIT meeting, prior to being submitted to ALT. The expected release date of the strategy is mid-June.</p>
5	<p>Lead CEs for SLAs/workstreams</p> <p>ALT agreed that clarification is needed around the roles, responsibilities and level of engagement of sponsors and lead CEs for the SLAs and workstreams.</p> <p>Peter Bramley agreed to be the lead CE/chair/sponsor for Child Health and Quality and Safety SLAs. An updated table of the groups, facilitators, chairs and associated CEs and sponsors is attached.</p>
6	<p>Update from ISSLA</p> <p>The business case for the Regional Service Provider Index (RSPI) is progressing well and a three month resource extension was approved, given the scope and scale of the process. Nelson Marlborough DHB is working towards SI PICS go live at the end of April – the next major step towards regional implementation and the first install of the system outside Canterbury.</p>
7	<p>Welcome to Paula Trembath, who is the new personal assistant to SIAPO's general manager, Mark Leggett. Paula has replaced Eila Cunnah, who moved into a project role for the Southern Cancer Network.</p>
